From the District Chairperson

Looking back to this time last year, we were waiting for transformation, all a little unsure about what this would require and how it would play out. Fast forward 12 months, and Wrexham District has helped pave the way for groups and our new team's back approach means that together we are stronger and ready for the future.

The District Trustees have focussed on supporting all Groups across the District to establish working Group Trustee Boards. Information evenings, information packs, meetings with parents and advice to Group Trustee Board Chairs and Treasurers have left in a good position with all but two of our groups now having at least the minimum number of trustees. A particular thanks go to Mike and Rob for their tireless efforts in meeting with parents and local groups.

Whilst financially we have been challenged by rising utility costs, we managed to not increase HQ rental costs, offset in part by a long-term contract to use the facilities in the mornings. Our finance sub-committee has streamlined and improved our financial processes and has given us greater visibility over our reserves and expenditure. Thanks to Karen and Jen for their work and support with this. We are mindful that running and maintenance costs are high and will need to be

carefully monitored. We have continued to administer the Quiet Fund having made over 12 grants in the last year and recently announced details of a Group Development and Support Fund through which we will be looking to help groups. Group Chairs and Lead Volunteers – please. please do consider how you could use these additional funds.

The ongoing potential move of HQ has at times dominated our meetings. We are now entering (hopefully) the final stages of agreeing plans and terms with Wrexham County Borough Council. The outline plans look exciting and will give us a fit for the future modern building. Thanks go to Sue, Paul and Butch for their work on this project. In the meantime, Paul continues to oversee ensuring we are minimising risks and we recently installed a new fire alarm system in the building.

Thanks to everyone who volunteers with Scouting in Wrexham. On a lovely warm (and dry) summer day, we celebrated the contributions of many of you at Cox Wood. I should have added up the years of experience and contribution being celebrated. You are what makes scouting so thank you.

Finally, the District Trustees wish to place on record their thanks to Moz for all he has done. As sad as it is to see you move on to a new role, we know you have left the district in a strong position. We will miss you (but don't worry we have your number!).

- 2. Names of all positions held: District Chair Nicola Morris, District Treasurer Karen Cheesbrough, District Secretary Paul Forret, District Executive Committee members: Sue Lister, Mike Meadows, Dave Cheesbrough, Lisa Jones, Neil Curtis, Elizabeth Dodman, Steven Brown, Sam Wilde, and Ian McLean, District Lead Volunteer David Morris, District Youth Leads Ethan King and Megan Sayer, District Explorer Scout Commissioner Steve Love
- 3. The District's governing documents are those of The Scout Association. They consist of a Royal Charter, which in turn gives authority to the Bye Laws of the Association and the Policy, Organisation and Rules (POR) of the Scout Association. The District is a trust established under the Policy, Organisation and Rules of the Scout Association.
- 4. The trustees are appointed in accordance with the Policy, Organisation and Rules of the Scout Association.
- 5. The District is led by the District Leadership Team and managed by a District Trustee Board. They are accountable to the District Scout Council for the satisfactory running of the District.
- 6. The Trustee Board exists to support the District Leadership Team in meeting their responsibilities.
- 7. Members of the Trustee Board act collectively as charity Trustees of the Scout District, and in the best interests of its members to:
 - a) Comply with the Policy, Organisation and Rules of The Scout Association
 - b) Protect and maintain any property and equipment owned by and/or used by the District
 - c) Manage the District finances.
 - d) Provide insurance for people, property and equipment.
 - e) Provide sufficient resources for Scouting to operate. This includes, but is not limited to, supporting recruitment, other adult support, and fund-raising activities.
 - f) Promote and support the development of Scouting in the local area.
 - g) Manage and implement the Safety Policy locally
 - h) Ensure that a positive image of Scouting exists in the local community.
 - Appoint and manage the operation of any sub-Committees, including appointing a Chair to lead the sub-Committees
 - j) Ensure that Young People are meaningfully involved in decision making at all levels within the District
 - k) The opening, closure and amalgamation of Groups as necessary.
 - I) And all other duties as set out in Policy, Organisation and Rules.
- 8. Risk and Internal Control.
 - a) The Trustee Board is responsible for risk management and ensures a risk register and risk assessments are in place.
 - b) The Trustee Board is responsible ensuring sufficient buildings and contents insurance in place to mitigate against permanent loss.

- c) The District is primarily reliant upon income from subscriptions and fundraising.
- d) The District is totally reliant upon volunteers to run and administer the activities of the District. If there were a reduction in the number of volunteers to an unacceptable level, then there would have to be a contraction, consolidation or closure of activities or Groups.
- 9. The primary objective of the District is that of the Scout Association generally, namely: 'to actively engage and support young people in their personal development, empowering them to make a positive contribution to society.'
